Our Lady has paved the way to recovery by her obedience and humility.

To be consecrated to her means to adopt as far as we can her ways of responding to God.

As the Legion of Mary we bring her presence into the world, we carry her to the people. We are not just selling ourselves but bringing something much greater to the task.

When we pray for peace it is not only that people stop fighting but that they will come to see each other as children of the one God, with all essentially wanting the same thing, whatever cultural or racial difference there may be.

We have a long way to go to see the improvement we need, but at least let us begin with wanting the right things in a full reconciliation of humanity with God.

We cannot make progress if God is denied, ignored, or given only nominal attention.

We are looking for a real conversion of heart and mind, for Russia, and other nations as they turn to the light.

We do what we can as the Legion and as individuals; we pray that others will contribute as they can.

May her Immaculate heart gather all people into full union with God as achieved first in her.
